Community Safety Tip

from the Yarramalong Rural Fire Brigade

During the recent storm in the valley, a local resident was unfortunate enough to have their house struck by lightning. This resulted in the complete destruction of their electrical switchboard. The switchboard was located in an enclosed cupboard, but luckily for them, the area around it was clear. If the area had been cluttered, this event could easily have led to a serious fire. We wish to remind you to make sure that there are no combustible materials located around your switchboard, particularly if it is in an enclosed area. It is also a good idea to keep a fire extinguisher in an appropriate location in your household. Suitable extinguishers for electrical fires include Dry Chemical Powder and Carbon Dioxide (CO₂). Do not use a Water or Foam extinguisher on an electrical fire, and always call 000.
