Community Safety Tip

from the Yarramalong Rural Fire Brigade

The cooler months of the year are a time to not become complacent about fire safety. As we switch on all of our heating appliances, make sure that electrical cords are not frayed, or power boards overloaded. Ensure that appliances are properly installed and maintained, as per manufacturers instructions. Do not place heaters near curtains, clothes or other flammable materials. If you have an electric blanket, an easy way to test if it is working properly is to place it on top of your bed and turn it on. After five minutes thoroughly check the blanket for frayed cords or scorch marks. If any are present, make sure you do not use the blanket and replace it with a new one.
